


2020 Census Highlights

- Mandated by Article 1, Section 2 of the U.S. Constitution, the census is a count of every person living in the United States and its territories.
- Beginning in March 2020, invitations for the 2020 Census arrived in mailboxes.
- Due to COVID-19, data collection was extended to October 15, 2020.



Strong Self-Response

- First census with an internet-response option for all households.
 - Two-thirds of households self-responded
 - Majority responded online
 - No down-time





What's Next?

Redistricting Data (PL 94-171)

- Statistics used by states to redraw boundaries for Congressional and state legislative districts to be released August 16, 2021.
- Includes population information at local geographic level on race, ethnicity and housing ownership.
- Provided in legacy format and posted on FTP site.
- Same data released in more user-friendly format by September 30, 2021

Demographic and Housing Characteristics Data

Privacy and Accuracy

- Protecting individual privacy is the law and core to our mission. Responses to the 2020 Census are confidential and cannot be shared.
- Redistricting data will be the first release of 2020 Census data using a cutting-edge mathematical framework, Differential Privacy, that protects individual information while letting us share important statistics about communities.
- Quality census statistics are critically important for communities. Differential privacy allows us to balance privacy and accuracy.

Data Quality

- Numerous quality checks built into collecting the data
- Conducted one of the most comprehensive reviews in recent census history during data processing, including review by outside experts.
- Despite the challenges of 2020, the completeness and accuracy of the first 2020 Census results are comparable with recent censuses.




